

## TOPIC: ask and answer questions about geography

**Instructor directions:** Your WEBLIO student has indicated that she wishes to practice asking and answering questions about **geography of your country**. This may potentially be the most challenging topic for students. Please initiate the conversation for this lesson. Please remember that students will be taking notes during this session. If they appear to not understand or have misunderstood, then encourage them to use appropriate conversation strategies (e.g. *“Could you repeat that please?”* *“How do you spell that?”*, etc)

Ask these questions:

What is the highest mountain in your country?	
How high is it?	Help students saying big numbers. Make sure they use the correct unit of measurement.
What is the longest river in your country?	
How long is it?	Help students saying big numbers. Make sure they use the correct unit of measurement.
What is the biggest lake in your country?	
How big is it?	Help students saying big numbers. Make sure they use the correct unit of measurement.
Do you have four seasons in your country?	Maybe expand this question to ask “What is your favorite season? Why do you like it? What things do you do or eat in this season?”
What's the hottest month of the year?	
What's the coldest month of the year?	
What's the average temperature in summer?	Help students saying big numbers. Make sure they use the correct unit of measurement.
What's the average temperature in winter?	Help students saying big numbers. Make sure they use the correct unit of measurement.
Do you have a lot of rain?	
What's the biggest city in your country?	
What's the population of your country?	Help students saying big numbers. Make sure they use the correct unit of measurement.
What's the capital city of your country?	
How would you describe the people in your country?	This question asks for a general impression of the national character or trait.
