n. cafeteria	a place where people get food	Let's take our lunch at the cafeteria .
adj. tight	limited; low in supply	I'm on a tight budget.
adj. inexpensive	low in price; cheap	I will have something inexpensive .
n. budget	an amount of money available for spending	I'm on a tight budget .
